OPENING LISBOA: MULAMBÖ & ÍRIS HELENA

25 — 28.05.2023 STAND 0P04 CORDOARIA NACIONAL At ARCO Lisboa 2023, Portas Vilaseca Galeria presents a special project that brings together the most recent production of Brazilian artists Íris Helena and Mulambö, whose current research and practices converge.

The works on display at the gallery stand (OPO4) bring up the theme of foreign immigration in Portugal and the construction of the capital of Brazil (Brasília) by migrants, generating a reflection on the political and social developments of these historical and current events.

Through works in different media and with his unique ability to give to everyday objects new meanings, Mulambö addresses a topic of great relevance and debate in contemporary times. With his sharp and critical eye, the artist deals with the political and social consequences of immigration, in works that reveal symbolic nuances of this relationship developed with the host country, exploring issues such as xenophobia and the collective search for the reconstruction and renewal of a country.

The works "Bandeira da Reconstrução Coletiva" [Collective Reconstruction Flag] and "Reviravolta pra tua terra" [Turnaround to your land] have been especially conceived for ARCO Lisboa 2023, based on the issue of immigration in Portugal in the 21st century. Flags as support have already been used by Mulambö in different contexts. In this case, there is an approximation between the flag as an official civic symbol of a nation and the iconic uniform of urban workers. On the other hand, with the neon work, there is a semantic play and a shift in perspective when using the infamous xenophobic phrase "come back to your land". The process of creating these new works motivated Mulambö to get back to his seminal installation "Gengiva" (2019), re-installed at the fair - in a local context and built with local bricks. Four years after its first appearance, the work's original idea remains: a structuring arch that keeps us alive.

Furthermore, Iris Helena sheds light on the issue of migrant workers who built Brasília and ended up founding the peripheral communities around Brazil's new capital city. Her series "Livro do Tombo" (2018 - ongoing) comprises works that simulate a kind of contemporary archeology of these traces of life, among civil construction works. The artist leads us to reflect on the history and memory of these migrant workers and their relationships with the new "Shangri-la" of the tropics.

In the set of works "Addressed to", by means of UV photographic prints applied to pink wooden boards (widely used as siding on construction sites), Íris rescues the story of workers who, before moving to the future capital Brasília (fleeing from hunger and drought), sent letters to former President Juscelino Kubitschek asking for a piece of land. When they migrated to the huge construction site that was set in the center of the country, they were unable to inhabit the city that they helped to build. These workers were taken to the margins, to the peripheral communities.

Conceived as postcards and displaying archival images of the daily lives of workers on the construction sites, these small folding signs can be manipulated by the public, as well as the 2018 work that started the series, displayed in a reserved space on the stand. In this piece, the image of the monumental sculpture "Candangos" can be seen, still under construction in what would become Praca dos Três Poderes (Three Powers Plaza) - a space that symbolizes the strength and balance between the powers of the Brazilian Republic. When reflecting on the construction of Brasilia, the artist points to a sumptuous achievement that made it possible to erase several stories of migrant workers. This erasure can also be observed in "Lost and Found", two works developed from the use of bricks that "reveal" archival images of a modern Brazil under construction. "Today's construction will be tomorrow's ruin", Íris concludes.

By connecting the research and practice of Mulambö and Íris Helena, the idea is to create a dialogue between different realities, however, intertwined through a common theme. Through a variety of media and techniques used by both artists, we aim to instigate the public at ARCO Lisboa 2023 to reflect on labor relations, migration and the construction of identities in different historical and cultural contexts.















Íris Helena

1987 - João Pessoa, PB, Brazil Lives and works in Brasília, DF, Brazil

A multidisciplinary artist whose research and practice focus on a critical, philosophical and poetic investigation of urban landscapes. Íris Helena incorporates images of the city within the surfaces / supports she chooses to materialize them. The precarious and ordinary supports are often removed from their daily consumption and enable the construction / reconstruction of memory linked to risk, instability and, above all, to the desire for erasure.

Graduated in Visual Arts from the Universidade
Federal da Paraíba. Also holds a Master's Degree
in Contemporary Poetics and is currently doing
her pHd in Displacements and Spatialities in
Contemporary Art at Universidade de Brasília.

Íris Helena has taken part in several artist residencies in Brazil and abroad, such as a special residency programme commissioned by the Brazilian Foreign Affairs Ministry during the "Year of Germany in Brazil" in Frankfurt, Germany (2013); and most recently, the Pé Vermelho Residency Programme, in Planaltina, DF, Brazil (2023); and the Vila Sul Residency Programme, at the Goethe Institut Salvador, BA, Brazil (2020).

In 2018, she was awarded the PIPA Prize (1st place - online category), and in 2017 she was one of the 3 artists awarded with the FOCO Bradesco ArtRio Prize.

Her works are part of important Brazilian institutional collections, such as the Gilberto Chateaubriand Collection, Museum of Modern Art - MAM, Rio de Janeiro; Museu de Arte do Rio - MAR; Pipa Institute; Ministry of Foreign Affairs - Itamaraty; among others.



Mulambö

1995 - Saquarema, RJ, Brazil Lives and works in Saquarema, RJ, Brazil

Born João in 1995, the artist grew up as MULAMBÖ in Praia da Vila, in the city of Saquarema, Rio de Janeiro, where he lives and works. He takes symbols and materials from everyday life seeking for a "re-foundation" of the narratives that surround people's lives. Football, Carnival, his family and the stories that have built the ground where he lives emerge in his research and practice through paintings, objects, flags and installations, pointing up the idea that he makes art to affirm that "there is no museum in the world like our grandmother's house".

The artist presented his works in two critically acclaimed solo shows in Rio de Janeiro, in 2019: "Tudo Nosso", at MAR - Museu de Arte do Rio; and "Prato de Pedreiro", at Centro Municipal de Arte Hélio Oiticica. In 2021, he presented his first solo show at Portas Vilaseca Galeria, "Mulambö all in gold". In the same year, he was selected to exhibit for the first time outside Brazil, at the Das Schaufenster space, in Seattle (USA), where he presented the solo show "Out of many, muchos más"; and also at Haus der Kunst, in Munich (Germany), in the group exhibition "SWEAT", curated by Anna Schneider and Raphael Fonseca.

In 2022, he was commissioned to develop the series of paintings "O couro come" for the Inhotim Institute, MG, Brazil; and also the installation "O penhor dessa igualdade", for the CCSP Exhibition Programme, in São Paulo, Brazil.

His works are part of important Brazilian collections, including: Museu de Arte do Rio - MAR (Rio de Janeiro, RJ); Pinacoteca do Estado de São Paulo (São Paulo, SP), The Ingá Museum (Niterói, RJ) and The Inhotim Institute (Brumadinho, MG).
